**A**s fans of the Netflix documentary *Making a Murderer* know, there are serious doubts as to whether **Steven Avery**, 54, and his nephew **Brendan Dassey**, 27, are truly guilty of the rape and murder of photographer **Teresa Halbach** in 2005. In August, Brendan's conviction was overturned by a judge who believes investigators may have coerced a confession from the then-teen, who has an IQ said to be in the "low average to borderline range." And now, after a decade behind bars, he's been released from prison, pending an appeal by prosecutors. "We're just so grateful," said his lawyer, Lauren Nirider, noting that this Thanksgiving will be the first Brendan has spent with his mother in 10 years. It's a stunning development — one that has implications for Steven's appeal as well.

"Steven's lawyers can say that police officers' conduct in getting [Brendan's] confession should make you second-guess whether they planted evidence against him," L.A. criminal defense attorney Alexandra Kazarian, who is not involved in the case, tells *OK!*. (Indeed, Steven's lawyers have already filed a motion for further testing of the evidence used to convict him.) "They can argue that what the officers did to Brendan was so outrageous, the judge should now look at their behavior toward Steven in a different light." For Steven, currently serving life without parole, it could be his only hope.
